

Boston Brilliance is a two-night Festival of Light, celebrating the rich and unique history of Boston Lincolnshire.

Lighting up the whole town in a kaleidoscope of colour, from Cammacks all the way through to Sam Newsom. Supported by Arts Council England and led by Boston College and the Story Tellers NPO, and produced by The Projection Studio's Ross Ashton and Karen Monid, this event aims to highlight the rich history that Boston holds and the amazing artistic talent within it.

Buildings involved in this project are Cammacks, Waterstones, Pescod Square and Pescod Hall, St Botolph's, St Botolph's Footbridge, The Assembly Rooms, Sam Newsom, Boston Guildhall, and Fydell House. With Cammacks, Waterstones and Sam Newsom having work produced by Boston college students with the themes Brilliance, Boston Life, and By Sea By Land respectively. Along side the college's work contributions Pescod Hall, and the front and rear of The Assembly Rooms shall be produced by artists from France, Lithuania, Spain and England respectively. Inspired by Sir Joseph Banks' travels with Captain Cook to the South Seas, the installation brings history to life through vibrant soundscapes and dazzling illuminations. The installation will feature sculptures in the rear garden by Sue Gavey.

THE GUILDHALL

Activates and Talks

Built in the 1390 by the Guild of St Mary, The Guildhall boasts a rich history and a long-standing connection to the Pilgrims and the foundation of the United States of America. The Guild of St Marys being a significant religious fraternity and one that is most important in medieval England due to their direct connections to the Pope and their wealth. In the present day the Guildhall stands and a museum of Boston's history including The Pilgrims, take a look inside and see what you discover. For the Boston Brilliance event. The Guildhall is the host of many activities and talks. On the lower floor there shall be kids' arts and crafts, with VR experiences on the top floor based around The Mayflower.

ASSEMBLY ROOMS

Front Diptych (Video Architects) Two sides, two elements, two technologies, two conversations, two components that form a common whole. Light and darkness, music and image, experimentation and deliberate steps, spaciousness and openwork detail, leading to fusion and forming the overall picture. Through spatial light structures, the architecture of music and sound, and the synergy of several different elements, the facade of the Assembly Rooms, Boston will tell its tale in the project "Diptych".

Rear The Kraken (Pep Palau and Karen Monid) A rendition of *The Kraken* by *Alfred*, *Lord Tennyson*. Brought to life by stunning visuals created by Pep Palau. With audio work by Karen Monid, working with local people to read extracts from the poem.

ST BOLTOPH'S BRIDGE

Bridge of Light

St Botolph's Bridge in the centre of Boston will transform into a vibrant "Bridge of Light," featuring dynamic, multi-coloured animations. Designed by lighting artist Alex Birch, the installation will create a mesmerizing display that shifts and flows with radiant hues. The everchanging lights will enhance the bridge's architectural form, turning it into a glowing landmark that captivates passersby. Pedestrians will be free to cross the bridge while it is illuminated, immersing themselves in the dazzling spectacle.



ST BOLTOPH'S

Activities

St. Botolph's Church, often known as 'Boston Stump', is spectacular from outside and in and is described by Pevsner as a 'giant among English Parish churches'. Replacing an earlier Norman church, construction of the present building commenced in 1309 at the east end and was completed by 1390, apart from the tower. The tower construction was started in 1425-1430 but not completed until 1510-1520. As part of Boston Brilliance it will be the host of many activities for all to enjoy.

These illuminations, meticulously created by hand, serve as a testament to the human pursuit of beauty and storytelling through art. In this piece, I reimagine the façade of Pescod Hall as a living parchment. 


NOEMI PRUD 'HOMME

VIRTUAL EXHIBITION LAUNCH TALK WITH DR JOSHUA BLAMIRE

Boston Guildhall Friday 14th Feb 4:00 pm - 5:30 pm

Cosmopolitan Boston is led by Dr Joshua Blamire at the Institute for Community Research and Development working with Historic England.

The project has engaged a group of local residents to explore the hidden histories and heritage of Boston that show the town and region to be a historically diverse and cosmopolitan place.

We have carried out historical research and gathered local stories. Working with local graphic designer Mark Baker, we have now developed a virtual exhibition to showcase the findings in an engaging and stimulating way.

At this launch we will provide a demonstration of the exhibition, and the residents will reflect on their experiences of participating in this innovative local heritage project.

NEIL WRIGHT

Boston's Cultural and Architectural Legacy

Neil Wright was born in Boston, Lincolnshire, and is a historian of that town. Since 1964 he has written many books and articles about the history of that Boston and the wider history of Lincolnshire, which is the second largest county in England. On three occasions he has been Chairman of the Society for Lincolnshire History and Archaeology, which was founded in the 1840s.

BOSTON'S CULTURAL AND ARCHITECTURAL LEGACY TALK WITH NEIL WRIGHT

Boston Guildhall Friday 14th Feb 4:00 pm - 5:30 pm

Boston boasts a rich history stretching nearly a thousand years. Neil Wright, author of Boston in 50 Buildings, will offer an insightful journey through the town's unique architectural and cultural legacy. His presentation delves into key historical and architectural features, including:

The Market Place: A remarkable site continuously in use for its original purpose for nearly 950 years.

Medieval Street Plan and Buildings: Despite changes over centuries, Boston retains much of its medieval street layout, along with several structures dating back to this period.

Connections to the USA: The Pulpit in St. Botolph's Church

represents Boston's connection to American history.

Georgian Warehouses and Buildings: Landmark Georgian structures such as the Corporation Building and Assembly Rooms echo Boston's 18th-century prosperity.

Tuxfords Engineering Firm: Established in the 19th century, Tuxfords became internationally recognized, further cementing Boston's influence beyond its borders.

Jean Ingelow: A distinguished 19th-century poet with roots in Boston, Ingelow was a notable literary figure who, despite her talent and popularity, never achieved the title of Poet Laureate due to the gender biases of her time.

These buildings shed light on Boston's significant role in British and transatlantic history, celebrating its architectural and cultural evolution.

SEB FALK

Navigating the Past: Discover Medieval Maritime Connections with Historian



A historian, teacher, and broadcaster, Seb Falk is a Cambridge University scholar celebrated for his expertise in the history of navigation. In 2016, he was named a BBC/AHRC New Generation Thinker. His widely acclaimed first book, The Light Ages, brings medieval science vividly to life, telling the story of an adventurous monk whose life offers a window into the intellectual world of medieval Europe. The book was named a Book of the Year 2020 by The Times, The TLS, and The Telegraph.

to interpret and share Grosseteste's
scientific writings in a modern context.
Professor Gasper's research spans
theology, Patristic thought, and
the history of science, making his
insights into Grosseteste's legacy
both profound and accessible.

EXPLORING THE COSMOS:
ROBERT GROSSETESTE'S
VISION OF THE UNIVERSE WITH
PROFESSOR GILES GASPER

Join Professor Giles Gasper, a leading historian of medieval science from Durham University, for an eye-opening journey into the universe as seen through the eyes of Robert Grosseteste, Bishop of Lincoln. Grosseteste, one of the most remarkable scholars of the 13th century, penned influential treatises on topics ranging from optics to astronomy, each revealing his profound curiosity and mathematical insights about the natural world.

In this talk, Professor Gasper will explore Grosseteste's groundbreaking theories on the cosmos, particularly his famous work *On Light*, where he envisions the creation of the universe as beginning with a "big bang" moment—a surprisingly modern view for a medieval thinker. This talk will delve into Grosseteste's intricate blend of mathematics, theology, and philosophy, revealing how his scientific inquiries connected the heavens and Earth in fascinating ways.
